



AVIATION WARFARE SYSTEM OPERATOR FIRST CLASS (RET) GARY N. GRISHAVER

Aviation Warfare Systems Operator First Class (Ret), Gary N. Grishaver is currently a volunteer at the Retiree Activities Office, 35th Fighter Wing, Misawa Air Base, Japan. He is responsible for providing assistance and information to approximately four hundred and fifty retirees, dependents and survivors of military retirees in northern Japan (to include the prefectures of Fukushima, Yamagata, Miyagi, Iwate, Akita, Aomori and the northern island of Hokkaido). Additionally, he assists in casualty affairs, social security, tax preparation, and ensuring survivors of military personnel from all branches of service receive the benefits to which they are entitled.

Petty Officer Grishaver, a native of Randolph, MA enlisted in the Navy on June 26, 1976. On January 11, 1977, he departed Boston, MA to attend Recruit Training at San Diego, CA. Following Aviation Antisubmarine Warfare Operators "A" school at Memphis, TN, he attended Flight Training at Naval Air Station Jacksonville, FL. In January 1978, he reported to Patrol Squadron 24, Jacksonville, FL, where he flew on the P3-C Orion aircraft and worked in tactics. In September 1979, Petty Officer Grishaver transferred to the Antisubmarine Warfare Operations Center training school in Dam Neck, VA. In February 1980, he departed for Patrol Wing One



Detachment Misawa, Japan, where he provided ASW mission support to forward deployed squadrons. In April 1984, he reported to Patrol Wing Ten, Moffett, CA, where he was selected to lead a Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Special Project. In June 1987, he returned to Misawa, Japan, where he continued his work in Special Projects. In June of 1992, he departed for Pensacola, FL to attend recruiting school. In September of 1992, he reported to Naval Recruiting District (NRD) New England and was assigned to the Navy Recruiting Station at Quincy, MA, where he served as an Enlisted Recruiter until his selection as NRD New England's Recruiter/Classifier. On October 18, 1996, his retirement ceremony was held at Naval Air Station South Weymouth, MA. Petty Officer Grishaver, originally from Randolph, MA, resides in Misawa, Japan with his wife Atsuko (Yoshita) Grishaver and has five children: Randy, Matthew, Julie, Adam and Rika.

Petty Officer Grishaver, at retirement, was the Recruiter Classifier of Navy Recruiting District New England, at Boston, MA. Responsible for working with Navy applicants, he would help them find careers in the Navy and process their enlistment paperwork. Additionally, he filled the role of Statistician by tracking all daily applicant processing and assigned mission goals.
