

## MASTER SERGEANT (RET) WILLIAM H. TUTTLE

Master Sergeant (ret) William (Bill) Tuttle is a volunteer staff member at the Retiree Activities Office, 35<sup>th</sup> Fighter Wing, Misawa Air Base, Japan. He is responsible for assisting nearly four hundred and fifty retirees, dependents, and their survivors in the six prefectures of Tohoku (northeast Japan) and the northern island of Hokkaido. Areas of assistance include retirement benefits and entitlements, social security, casualty affairs, survivor benefits and tax preparation. His formal education in Japanese Language is beneficial in assisting the many Japanese surviving widows within the Misawa RAO jurisdiction.

MSgt Tuttle was born in Waltham, Massachusetts in 1961, and in 1965 moved with his family to Cape Cod, where he spent his entire youth. One year after graduating in 1979 from Bourne High School, MSgt Tuttle enlisted in the Air Force as an Automatic Flight Control Systems Technician (32530). MSgt Tuttle spent half of his 24-year Air Force career maintaining various avionic systems on C-130, B-52, KC-135, and RC-135 (SEI) aircraft. As a young Buck Sergeant, Sgt Tuttle was selected for a special duty assignment with Air Force Recruiting Service and spent five years as a non-prior enlisted recruiter in West Warwick, Rhode Island. Following his tour in AF Recruiting, SSgt Tuttle returned to avionics maintenance for another seven years, five of which were at a special duty assignment with the 82<sup>nd</sup>



Reconnaissance Squadron at Kadena AB, Okinawa. Eager to take on new challenges, TSgt Tuttle cross trained into another special duty assignment as a Professional Military Education instructor at the 35<sup>th</sup> Fighter Wing Airman Leadership School at Misawa Air Base. Here, he was responsible for preparing front-line supervisors for the Air Force, Army, Navy and Japan Air Self Defense Force. Upon promotion to the rank of MSgt, Tuttle was selected to replace the outgoing ALS Commandant. MSgt Tuttle served his final four years as the Commandant of Misawa's Airman Leadership School. After retirement from the Air Force in November 2004, MSgt Tuttle worked for Harley-Davidson Military Sales Far East Division until his retirement in 2016. Tuttle currently resides in Misawa City, Japan with his spouse Asako, daughters Sakura Liberty and Emily Kokoro, and son Barry Hikaru. He became a volunteer for the Retiree Activities Office in January 2021.
